Smoking

Smoking is not permitted inside the terminal. Ash urns are available in selected areas outdoors. The airport's ordinance prohibits smoking within 25 feet of any entrance to the building. Employees may smoke behind the wooden fence adjacent to the old terminal.

Door security

While working in the new spaces, it is easy to become distracted. Please remember to keep a watchful eye for unauthorized access to doors in the terminal. Each person is responsible for making sure all doors are secured before leaving them unattended. Door styles such as the bag belt doors and the door to the elevator running from the boarding room to the ramp are included in this requirement.
